



"March Madness." It is a time for high school and college sports teams in basketball tournament settings which recognizes that most

anything can happen.

Those teams that we anticipate can win "it all" sometimes do not. Teams that "have no chance" suddenly begin to gain momentum and win games that they should not. "March Madness" really reflects an unpredictable, chaotic nature of the world in which one sometimes encounters surprises and that there are times when life does not go as one might expect or want.

The disciples of Jesus who make their way through that week in Jerusalem that finds it genesis with Palm Sunday would have undoubtedly grasped

the concept of "March Madness."

Nothing went as they had expected or wanted. Beginning with a journey as Jesus rode in on a donkey rather than a war horse and then meandering the rest of the week through the streets of the city and coming to rest at a virtually unmovable stone rolled across the doorway of a burial site, this was not the way it was supposed to he.

These followers of Jesus were sad, hurting, confused - struggling to find some semblance of meaning or purpose in face of all they had seen and heard and experienced.

And they were left to wonder "what more could happen?"

Well, God answers that question. "March Madness" was not over. They were about to be confronted with the unpredictable, chaotic nature of life and faith. Something that they did not expect. Something that would fill them with fear. Something that they never, ever would have anticipated!

Right there in the middle of that which they had accepted as "the norm," God propels their

world into turmoil. Again, this was not the way that it is supposed to be. Jesus said "it is finished!" Dead is dead, right?

"What else could happen?"

#### Resurrection happens!!!

Easter reminds us that in the midst of life's journey, when we encounter those times and occasions of "madness," God is still here.

God does indeed lead us through the streets of confusion, watches over us in the days of uncertainty, comforts us in the times in which we are hurting and encourages us in the face of death.

But, even more God "surprises" us in that it is not that God merely is "with us" (the promise of Emmanuel before Jesus' birth).

But God does even more. God surprises everyone and through the resurrection of Jesus overcomes death. Death does not get the last word. Dead is not dead! Surprise!!!

God not only comforts those whom God loves, but God brings to life all of those times, occasions, situations, experiences in which we were "given up" or we ourselves "gave up" for dead.

Resurrection cries out to us that there is nothing, absolutely nothing that can take away God's love for us and God's power to bring new life and make us new creations

Yes, resurrection is true! We can trust in it!; We can live into it! We can experience this "Good News!" We can share this "Good News!"

So, welcome to "March Madness!" Everything changes on April 1. No fooling!!!

Some decisions are easy to make: a bowl of bland but healthy steel cut oatmeal **or** a warm, fragrant, gooey, frosted cinnamon roll. Other decisions are far more difficult and the Session was faced with a big one at the March meeting.

For the past three months we have benefited from the hard work of Adam who was introduced to us through Northwoods and has been cleaning our church at no cost to the church during this trial period. However, this trial period is over at the end of March. The church was under no obligation to hire Adam but, after much discussion, the Session voted to keep Adam and at the end of March he will become an employee of PPC and we will be paying his salary.

The benefits of his employment are many. Our church is very clean; he is thorough and gets into all the nooks and crannies. We have many groups using our church: 4H, Pastor's prayer gathering, the Creative Arts Festival, video Presbytery meetings, Interim Pastor training, music practice as well as the Wednesday night and Sunday morning services. We want the church safe and clean. Plus, we are providing employment for a disabled adult who likes the work he is doing here. (His job coach will continue to come with him but we are not paying his job coach.)

The Session is looking for ways to cover this expense but is also including "Keep Adam" on the church Wish List. Any contribution you can make to help cover Adam's employment costs would be appreciated. If you would like more detailed information please contact Pastor Dave or a Session member.

#### **BAKE SALE**

We had our first bake sale on March 11 and it was a huge success. We had delicious cookies, bars, breads, dirt cake, fresh eggs, chicken soup and jam. April 8 will be our next bake sale. The proceeds from our bake sales and produce days go to support our Stewardship Celebration Luncheon in the fall.

#### POUNDS FOR THE PANTRY

During the month of May we will again have a food drive for the Portage Food Pantry called "Pounds for the Pantry". Our goal is to raise 500# during that month. Each Sunday when you bring your food pantry items to church, they will be weighed and by the end of worship you will know how many pounds were collected that day. We will have a chart with the running total so you can see each week how close we are to meeting our goal.

The shelves at the Food Pantry have been pretty bare and some of the items needed most are peanut butter, jelly (in plastic containers if possible), tuna fish, pancake mix and syrup, Manwich, canned stews, spaghetti sauce and noodles, canned fruit, soups, cereal, soda crackers, hamburger helper, plastic gallon bottles of juice, ketchup and mustard. This is a great time to bring in bags of flour, sugar and laundry soap as they weigh more. Please check expiration dates as the food pantry can't accept any items that are expired. The first 2½ months of this year we have only donated 160 pounds to the pantry. Let's work hard to meet this goal of 500# in the month of May. Last year we surpassed our goal and collected 682.5 pounds.

The "Sharing Supper" will be shared on Monday, April 30!!!


Serving begins at 5:00 p.m. at the Bartels Middle School cafeteria.

During the week of July 15-21, folks from the Region 5 area will be travelling to Michigan for a "mission work camp" experience at Camp Westminster.

Camp Westminster is a Presbyterian camp near Roscommon, MI.

This mission trip is planned as a "multi-generational" experience - which means we will have young people and adults spending the week together working.

Our work will include maintenance and upkeep such as painting, staining, grounds keeping and working the trails. There may also be opportunities to be involved in a "Kids Against Hunger" packaging event where we will package meals for hungry families in the US and abroad. Or we may be helping to put together "Disaster Kits" used by the Presbyterian Disaster Service.

The costs for the trip will be \$330 per person which includes: lodging for one week, all meals, your choice of 3 activities (archery, ropes course, team building activities, etc.), and project materials. Our group will be assigned a team leader to help facilitate the activities. The bedding is arranged in bunks and you will need to bring blankets/sleeping bags along with you.

There will be additional costs for the trip to cover transportation.

If you are interested in participating in this summer's Mission Trip - you will need to sign-up with Pastor Dave <u>BEFORE</u> April 7!!! We will not be able to take names after this date.

In May we are looking forward to helping the Portage Food Pantry.


PPC should be proud of these young people as they "live out their faith" in helping and caring for the people in their community.

We are looking for additional people to come and help get people to and from the chapel.


