I cannot speak for anyone else, but I do find it quite a bit more challenging to consider what "God's vision" for PPC might be than what "my ideas" could be. For me it is much easier to share "my" ideas, suggestions, viewpoints and opinions.

But how can we possibly answer this from God's perspective? Here are some ideas that I am using that you may find helpful:

We can consider what God has done before in leading God's people. Our Scripture lessons which are available in this newsletter and at the board in Parry Hall provide for us a foundation of better understanding of God's interaction with God's people.

We can pray. Prayer is a way of opening our hearts and minds and lives to God's presence and God's leading. Praying with the Scripture lessons in mind or praying for this process of listening or praying for those "items" which have been tacked on the board or praying for PPC are all good ways to listen for God's moving in our midst.

We can talk together. We will have times after each of our worship services in August to sit and visit about "God's vision." This will be a simple opportunity to share what we are discerning and to listen to what others are thinking.

And we can trust. Trust that God is indeed at work in all of this reading and praying and listening and sharing. Trust that God still has a purpose for this church community and that God is not finished with us yet! And trust that what we find or discover in this journey will be what God needs us to learn or where God needs us to be.

The "board" will continue to be here in Parry Hall for us to make notes about what we are discovering as we ask the question "what is God's vision - what are God's dreams for PPC."



A.C.T.S. LOOKING 2 BEGIN THIS FALL


ACTS (After Confirmation Talks and Service) is a group of young people who have completed "confirmation" or who are of the middle school-high school age group.


