Everyone is invited to come on Sunday morning, December 1st (the First Sunday in Advent) for breakfast and to help decorate and prepare the sanctuary and church for the Advent and Christmas seasons.

We will <u>start decorating @ 8:00 a.m.</u> You may stop for breakfast at any time you like.

Then, we will stop our decorating to join together in our time of worship.

If we have decorating to finish, we will do so after the worship service.

Those of any age, skill level or decorating prowess are encouraged to come and share in this time together.

PEACE & GLOBAL WITNESS

The Peace & Global Witness offering was was collected on "World Communion Sunday", October 7th. We collected \$214.00 of which (\$53.50) stays locally.

CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING

A Presbyterian tradition for almost seventy years, the Christmas Joy Offering is one of four special offerings designated by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church to provide congregations direct ways of supporting specific causes that help those in need.

The receipts from the offering are distributed equally to the Board of Pensions for assistance programs and to Racial Ethnic and Women's Ministries/Presbyterian Women of the General Assembly Mission Council to support Presbyterian racial ethnic education.

The Christmas Joy Offering will be received on December 15 & 22 during worship service. If you have boxed church envelopes, there is a Christmas Joy envelope included.

COMMUNITY CHRISTMAS DINNER

This will be the 21st year the Portage Presbyterian Church has opened its doors on Christmas day for a free mid-day dinner for people in the community. Last year's event provided a meal for about 150+ people and it is anticipated that at least that many will be served this year. The Christmas dinner was initiated to provide a gathering place and festive meal for people who would otherwise be alone or could not provide a holiday meal for their family. Generous donations from the congregation and the community have supported the event. One of the factors contributing to its success is that many individuals and families. including many from outside our congregation, help. The meal served is turkey and ham, dressing, mashed potatoes, vegetable, cranberry and rolls along with dessert and beverage. Meals can be delivered to shut-ins by calling the church office ahead of time. Dinner will be served from noon to 1:30 P.M. We are in need of help that day. Please contact Nancy Schaper at 742-7242 if you are willing to volunteer a few hours of your time or sign up on the sheets in Parry Hall. There is also a signup sheet for donations of Christmas cookies for our dessert.

"Per Capita" provides the "whole church" with the means to strengthen the connections of our work and build lasting relationships which help all Presbyterians share God's love through mission and ministry.





Pastor's Page

'The following can be found in an Advent book called "Faces At the Manger" by J. Barrie Shepherd. One of the writings included in the compilation is titled "Angels and Animals."

I like to read this every year as I prepare to move into Advent - as, for me, it puts much into perspective.

I hope that you will find this tidbit meaningful, inspirational and hopeful for you in this time of the year.

The mystery and manure of Christmas. What kind of theme is that for a decent, upright, respectable Presbyterian poet to address, especially in this clean and tinsel-shiny, balsam-scented season of the year. The mystery and the manure of Christmas?

Yet this unlikely combination is precisely what we are faced with when we recognize that there has been, according to the evidence of Scripture and tradition, a place reserved both for angels and animals within that holiest of moments when the Divine entered, became a living, breathing part of its own creation. The mystery and the manure of Christmas.

This confrontation comes, although it shouldn't, as something of a shock to us today. We inhabit an increasingly anthropocentric world ... all the way to the current scene where indeed, "people are the measure of all things," and all things revolve around, serve the needs of and exist for the sake of humankind.

Even a century ago, half century ago, people were in closer daily touch with the other created orders of being. Cows had to be milked, by hand, each day. Horses needed to be groomed, fed, cared for. Eggs were to be gathered, barns, pig sties to be swept and shoveled out, furnished with clean, sweet-smelling straw.

So it is when we look back at the stories of Christmas; when we are faced, for example, with the fact that Isaiah foresaw the blissful heavenly kingdom basically in terms of peace among the animals ... and so forth; or when we come upon this record that Christ came, not into a human habitation, but to a stable; and that his birth was heralded, not by any pre-Christmas media blitz, but by a bunch of herald angels out on a lonely hillside; we are not sure what to make of it.

Yet this is where it all took place. Not in some pseudo-rustic, plastic stable floodlit on a lawn; nor in some over-ornate baroque or rococo ecclesiastical excess; but in the grunge and grime, the smell and din of an honest-to-Godness, cowshed, somewhere in the hills of Palestine.

And it's important, may even be crucial, that it happened among the animals because it sets us in our rightful place; not at the center, where we like to be, expect to be; but as one with all the rest of God's creation, animal, vegetable, mineral - yes the very stars on high present and witnessing the birth of God into the heart of God's own creation.

The mystery, then, and the manure of Christmas. A cause for us to wonder, simply wonder. And in our manufactured, matter-offact twentieth century (now 21st century) that may not be such a bad place to begin.

May God bless you and keep you in the journey in and through Advent, Christmas and into Epiphany.

CHRISTMAS OFFERING

PPC RECEIVES SPECIAL WORSHIP "GIFT"

The Session has continued to explore opportunities for our worship accompaniment.

We have been blessed that Lee Roundy and Carol Hermann have offered their musical gifts and time for different worship services. And we appreciate those services in which Judy Taylor has helped lead us in our "a capella" worship times.

Yet, what we have discovered in these last months is that it is very difficult to secure "worship accompaniment" in and around Portage.

Among the options of which the Session became aware was the use of "digital hymnals." We consulted with the Session of First Presbyterian Church in Cambria who have used their "digital hymnal" for over 1 1/2 years. And we even had one of their members bring their device to PPC for an "onsite demonstration."

As we considered this option, we received an "anonymous donation" to purchase a "digital hymnal" of our own - which we have done. We are very grateful for this generous gift to PPC.

It is a pretty impressive device that allows us to adapt and adjust the music to our own style, pace and form with which we are accustomed and comfortable. Our "red hymnal" is already downloaded on the device.

This "digital hymnal" is not intended to replace a "live-in person" worship accompanist. If we find a person / persons to fill this role, that will be wonderful. Rather, we will use this "digital hymnal" as a "supplement" to our worship accompanists.

Beginning in December, the "digital hymnal" will be introduced at different times in some of our worship services.

We understand that there will be a "learning curve" - both for those who are learning to use it - and for we who will be learning to sing with it. We hope that everyone will be patient as we learn together.

We will have a "learning time" on Wednesday, December 4 beginning about 6:45 p.m. for anyone who would like to learn more about the "digital hymnal" or who might like to learn how to use it for worship services.

For many of us Advent and Christmas can be times of families being together, of singing joyous songs, smiles and renewed hope.

However, for some of us, this is also a time which may be difficult and challenging. We may be dealing with things such as ...

- ≈ a change in or loss of a job
- the break-up of a relationship
- ≈ a death of a loved one
- ≈ a change or loss of health
- ≈ a loss of hope
- anger from unresolved situations
- ★ feeling overwhelmed by all of the demands and expectations
- a sadness that comes with the progressive darkness of the days

These are all some of the things that we may carry with us as we move through this time of the year - and which can make this season one of fear, dread and sadness.

Our "Service of Hope" worship service (on Dec 8 @ 2:00 p.m.) will provide anyone who comes a safe place, a sanctuary, where we can acknowledge what we are feeling without fear or judgment.

This is also a time when we reach out again to God, trusting that God will reassure us and renew us with His peace, His presence and His promise.

As we state for this evening, our prayer for this worship time is that we might have a moment of quiet peace as we reflect together on our journey to Bethlehem and this coming Christ. God will give us a hand in the darkness of our sorrow to move forward and to welcome the light of Christ, our eternal hope.

The "Service of Hope" worship service will be on *December 8*, @ 2:00 p.m. and will include the Celebration of the Lord's Supper.
