
#### **FAT SUNDAY**

#### HELP WITH "HOMESTEAD TAX CREDIT?"

Do you need your Wisconsin Homestead Tax Credit prepared and filed?

Lee Roundy has volunteered to prepare and mail Homestead Tax Credit (Schedules H & H-EZ) paper filings for PPC members for free.

Appointments can be set up after worship on Sunday, Feb 4<sup>th</sup>, Feb 18<sup>th</sup>, Mar 4<sup>th</sup>, and Mar 18<sup>th</sup>. Check the Kiosk in Parry Hall for the Homestead Tax Credit Fact Sheet to see if you qualify for the Credit. Lee will take the members on a first-come, first-served basis.

Appointments last 15 minutes, on average.

If you're married, your spouse is required to be present. For your security and credit preparation accuracy, please bring your photo ID or driver's license, Social Security card, all forms of taxable and non-taxable income, 2017 property tax bill if you own your home or completed Rent Certificate if you rent (blank certificates available on Kiosk). If you are required to file an income tax return (1040A, 1A, etc.), this credit will be prepared by your regular tax preparer as a part of that income tax return.

#### The Annual Report of the Pastor - 2018

Another year has come and gone and The Church of Jesus Christ here in Portage Continues to proclaim the "Good News of Great Joy." Despite the reality of the changing times in which we find ourselves, And even though things are not always easy we still believe that God is at work in and through this church community and that we do have a purpose and a mission and so we will seek to follow, to serve and to invite people to "come and see" and to be part of a community of faith in which there is a "place for everybody." God is still at work and so are God's people!

The above "scrolling image" is a reference (with apologies) to "Star Wars - The Last Jedi." In the movie there is an underlying allusion to what happens when one comes to the end of an era - and the inevitable questions of "what now?" and "where do we find hope?" come to the forefront. While this is a story of the larger struggle between good and darkness, it is also the story of individuals who are trying to find a sense of identity and purpose in the midst of all the chaos and uncertainty that is unfolding around them.

Unlike two of the other Gospels who tell the account of Jesus' life ministry and death from the point before His birth, the Gospel of Mark opens with these words ... "the beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." There are no heavenly messengers, no shepherds, no wise ones. In Mark's Gospel we encounter only John the Baptizer in the wilderness and then, Jesus who appears, is baptized and the heavens are ripped apart and a voice declares that this Jesus is "God's Son, the Beloved One; with whom God is well pleased."

This "baptismal beginning" of Jesus is a significant marker in his life. In the immediate time of transition, the affirmation of God provides both a sense of identity as he begins this new direction. But, in the larger, long-term picture this "experience" also becomes a foundation to which Jesus could, and probably did, return again and again. Knowing "who" he was and "whose" he was and "what" he was to do did offer hope and peace in the good and especially in those occasions when he may have wondered "what now?" and "where is the hope?"

We too are in a time of "beginnings." It is the beginning of a new calendar year of course. But we may also find that our journey as a church community continues to feel like a "wilderness time" in which we are left to wonder "what now?" and "where do we find hope?"

What Now? In a strange sense I believe that there is no better time for the church to exist than right here - right now. The world into which we are living in 2018 has a message and a purpose that the community and the world around us desperately need to hear and to experience. While I believe that "the message" does not change we are nevertheless being challenged to discover and learn the ways and means by which this "message" is effectively communicated. What has worked before may not be effective any more. And so we continue to strive to listen and learn and follow God's lead.

Where do we find hope? "Our help is in the Lord who made the heavens and the earth." (Psalm 124:8). We affirm that the work, ministry, even the existence of a church community does not rely on us. This is God's Church and we are God's people. And so we believe that the God who has made all of creation has called us together to do the mission and ministry which God needs done. Think of it this way - of all the people and churches God could have called, God has called us - together! "If God is for us, who or what could possibly be against us?" as Romans states. This is not a statement of arrogance, but one which reminds us, inspires us and empowers us to keep seeking God's will for us individually and congregationally. And to keep trusting and living out this faith, even in those times and circumstances which may seem difficult, uncertain and chaotic.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve with you as we continue to share and to be the "good news of great joy" to all people.

May God continue to bless, lead, inspire and empower us now and always.

#### PER CAPITA: AN OVERVIEW

#### Paying per capita is similar to

- contributing one's dish to a potluck meal
- paying to be connected to the internet
- paying for the benefit of utilities; such as electricity, water and telephone
- pitching in with other passengers to pay for gasoline for a road trip.
- participating in community supported agriculture (CSA) or a similar co-op

A brief history

The earliest mention of something like a per capita apportionment dates back to the 1700s.

In the mid 1800s, a "plan of mileage" was adopted by the General Assembly to defray the expenses of commissioners attending General Assembly meetings so that everyone could be present to participate regardless of distance or financial resources. Over time, per capita has been used to fund "ecclesiastical and administrative" functions that are shared by the whole church. In 1995, the following definition was developed:

Per capita is an opportunity for all communicant members of the Presbyterian church through the mid councils to participate equally, responsibly, and interdependently

by sharing the cost of coordination and evaluation of mission; and of performing ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions that identify a Reformed

Church, while at the same time strengthening the sense of community among all Presbyterians (GA Minutes, Part I, 1995).

#### Per capita is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together.

In essence, per capita is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Every Presbyterian shares in the benefit of the PC(USA)'s system of government, so every Presbyterian is asked to share the expenses associated with coordinating and performing the functions of that system.

#### Why per capita?

Per capita exists as a way for all Presbyterians to share costs that belong to the whole church, to give meaning to the interdependent nature Presbyterian polity.

Per capita is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. It exists to allow the whole church to share equitably in those things that make us Presbyterian:

- our theological identity
- our connectedness
- our system of mid councils that allow elders and ministers together to discern the mind of Christ
- our ecumenical connections that make us part of the church universal
- our core structures that keep us together as a church
- our call to work for full participation in decisionmaking

Per capita allows us to work with other churches to further the mission of Jesus Christ around the world.

Exod. 30:11-16 — "...the rich shall not give more, and the poor shall not give less, than the half shekel [for the sanctuary]...."

1 Cor. 12:7 — "To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good."
