"One Last Thought ..."

I was reading a devotional the day after Christmas, that noted that "after the excitement of the birth comes the realization that things are not going to be the same as they were before."

As I read this devotional, my mind wandered back to January of 1995. Kathy's father had suffered a severe stroke and was in the process of being transferred to the Maplewood Care Facility in Sauk City, WI. So much had changed and would never quite be the same as it has always been.

And yet one of the biggest changes was still coming - Kathy and I were going to be parents for the first time. The doctor had told us that our baby could arrive any time from Christmas on. And on January 15, Nicholas David arrived. What a time of excitement it was - and then reality set in. We were parents and we had just had a baby. WOW! This was not bad, mind you - it was just different - so different than what either of Nick's parents had ever experienced before. No, things would never be the same again.

And then, my mind made its way to November of 1996. We had made the move a year before to Portage when Nick was 10 months old. All with which we were familiar, the place and the people who had grown to be like an "extended family," the routines and traditions were left behind for a new call in Portage. Life, as we knew it, had changed.

And yet one of the biggest changes was still coming - Kathy and I were going to be parents for the second time. The doctor had planned for the baby to arrive on November 18. But, our baby had other ideas. And on November 14, Sarah Kathleen arrived. Again, this was such a time of excitement and joy - and then reality set in. We were parents "again" - we just had our second child - a girl - the first girl born in my family in over 50 years. WOW! Again, this was different - different than what either of Nick and Sarah's parents had ever experienced before. Things, indeed, would never be the same again.

And then I thought of those who had made their way to Bethlehem so long ago. "Things" would never, ever be the same again for any of them either.

Not for Mary and Joseph - who will be making an unexpected detour to Egypt before heading "home" to Nazareth. They were parents for the first time - and now they were on the move, leaving behind that which they had known, those who were family, those traditions and routines which had been such an important part of their lives and going to a place they had never been before.

Not for the Shepherds - who had gone to the stable and found the Messiah (*just as the angel had told them*) - and then who went back to their "ordinary" lives. Yet, their lives were changed - they would never look at the stars, their lives and the promises of God's Messiah in the same way as before.

And certainly **not for the "Wise Ones"** - those who had started out on a journey, not really sure "where" they were going or "what" they would find once they came to their destination - those who had overcome a "wrong turn" and found just what they were looking for (*just not in a place they would have ever expected*). And now, they were "warned in a dream" to go home - by another completely different route than they had ever encountered before.

After Jesus' birth - things change - and nothing will ever be the same again.

It reminds me of one who noted "just when I think I have all the answers, someone goes and changes the questions."

Yet, this is the "journey of faith" upon which we have been invited (*called*?) to travel - as God's people and as God's church.

Think of the encounters that people in the Scriptures have with Jesus - though Jesus often meets people "right where they are" (*right in the middle of the muck-challenges-pain-tragedies-frustrations*) of life, yet Jesus never leaves those whom He meets where they are. People who encounter - are encountered by Jesus - are always called "*to change and to be changed*."

As we make our way from Bethlehem's stable - as we move into a new year (and all that lies ahead), may we be like those who were there "at the first Christmas" - those to whom God brings "good news of great joy for all the people" - those for whom this "good news" is, well, "good news" - and those who are willing to embrace (or at least recognize) the reality that in our willingness to follow Jesus, life will never be the same again.

As we make our way from Bethlehem's stable - as we move into another new year - may we see and experience both the joy and the anxiety of trusting God on this journey ...

- ✓ and that wherever and however we are encountered by God -
- ✓ that whatever we may be called to leave behind or learn anew -
- ✓ that whatever may seem just too ordinary ... or too unsettled ...
- ✓ that wherever God on this journey continues to lead us -
- ✓ that in the midst of all that unfolds God will continue to be "with us" and will be "the constant."

And so, let us continue our journey into this new year - and this new reality - as God's people and God's church ... confidently - compassionately - creatively - faithfully - joyfully - purposefully - hopefully - and prayerfully.

No, God through Jesus never promises us that "things will never change" or that "things will go back to normal." Rather, the promises of God in and through the Christ are that God will be with us - right here and right now - and will lead and empower us as we move ahead.
