BAKE SALE/PRODUCE DAYS





Pastor's Page

As we have made our way to Bethlehem, celebrated the birth of the Christ Child first with the shepherds and then with the wise ones and now have moved into a new year, I continue to be struck by the impact of the accounts of God at work in and through ordinary people.

"Do not be afraid!"

Over and over again in the accounts leading up to and including Jesus' birth we hear these words - "do not be afraid!"

Incidentally, these are not the only times we will hear or read these words - think "resurrection." But that's another article for another time.

Elie Wiesel famously said "If an angel ever says, 'Be not afraid,' you'd better watch out: a big assignment is on the way." As he notes God comforts with one hand and then shoves the people out into hard labor and danger with the other.

Yes, when we hear "do not be afraid" it usually suggests that there is a reason "to be afraid!"

In circumstances when "fear" could run rampant, God offers what seems to be a rather simple remedy - "do not be afraid."

What these words offer to us is the reality that there will be times when we are going to be afraid - and that's okay. This simply means we are human beings.

Yet, what these words also offer to us is the hope that even though we are afraid, God will not abandon us. In fact, these words give us something upon which to grasp and hang on.

For these are words which, despite the circumstances in which we may find ourselves despite what we may see or hear - despite what others may be telling us - these are words which give us a reason to hope and to trust and to keep going and to keep living.

If God is telling us not to be afraid, then there must be more going on here than what I or we can see. God must be with us and God must be at work in us and through us.

To borrow from the Apostle Paul, "if God is for us, who or what could possibly stand against us."

"PRESBYTERIAN YOUTH TRIENNIUM"

The Presbyterian Youth Triennium is a Presbyterian Church-wide youth gathering which will happen on July 16-20, 2019 at the Purdue University campus in West Lafayette, IN.

This is an event for high school age youth in the Presbyterian Church (USA) and the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

The theme for the 2019 event is "Here's My Heart".

This theme gets right to the heart of the matter. Drawing from the words of the hymn, Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing, "Here's My Heart" expresses our deepest desire to be part of something bigger and more beautiful than the tiny flicker of our own candles. It speaks of passion and identity. It speaks of purpose and action.

Interestingly enough it started with shenanigans! The story behind this beloved song by Robert Robinson begins with a group of teenagers showing up at an evangelistic meeting with the sole purpose of heckling the preacher. But a greater purpose and force was at work, and God's calling haunted Robert until he was able to one day proclaim, "Here's my heart."

We invite young people and their adult leaders to come experience God's love in a way so powerful and compelling that they, too, are moved to say, "Here's my heart". And together we will learn what it means to serve Christ with our intelligence, energy, imagination and love.

Costs for the PYT is equally divided between the John Knox Presbytery, the home church and the individual. It is estimated that the cost for each would be approximately \$220.00.

We will be meeting in the Fellowship Hall for this time - beginning at our normal Sunday morning time of 10:05 a.m.



COMMUNION SCHEDULE CHANGES - 2019

Beginning in January, 2019 the Session has approved the celebration of the Lord's Supper on the first Sunday of every month.

John Calvin, the founder of Presbyterianism, believed that the Lord's Supper was an integral part of one's faith experience and the church's worship experience and should be celebrated often.

While PPC has observed regular occasions of the Celebration of the Lord's Supper, or Communion, the Session also became aware that there were times during the year when there were "gaps" in the schedule which meant that for some who "missed" a particular day, those people may not have the chance to share in Communion for an extended period of time.

In conversations with a number of Presbyterian churches in our area we discovered that all with whom we talked observe the Lord's Supper on the first Sunday of each month.

Coming together around the Lord's Table at least once each month will provide a wonderful opportunity to be in communion with our Lord and with one another as God's people and God's church.

UPCOMING COMMUNION SCHEDULE

You are encouraged to take time before each Communion to reflect on the meaning of the Lord's Supper for you, for PPC and for the world.

The "Directory for Worship" notes that "in preparing to receive Christ in this Sacrament, the believer is to confess sin and brokenness, to seek reconciliation with God and neighbor, and to trust in Jesus Christ for cleansing and renewal."

As Presbyterians, we believe that coming to the Lord's Table is not a right, but a privilege given to those who come in faith, repentance and love the gifts of God for the people of God.
