

Pastor's Page

At our "joint meeting" of the Elders and Deacons in August, we spent time talking about "the missional church."

There are many different characteristics under the umbrella of "missional church."

Among these are:

- ✓ an *understanding* that the church is being called outside of the walls and to go out into the community;
- ✓ a recognition that God is already at work in the lives and in the life of a community (and we have to discover what God is doing);
- ✓ an approach that seeks, not to recreate, but to partner with those who are already doing ministry and to add our talents and support to that which they are already doing

Yet, perhaps the most essential facet of being missional" is that of being relational.

This suggests that the most effective way of "doing mission" is in the building of relationships with those around you so that you share with others not as a "stranger" or a "person with an agenda." Instead you share as a friend, someone they have come to know and trust and to whom they will listen.

In such a "relational approach" we are being given the opportunity to hear another's "story." To be invited into another's life to hear who they are, what has brought them to this place and their hopes and dreams for the future.

As we can see, this is a much different approach to "doing mission."

- For mission as that which is needed and which is happening right in the neighborhood and community around us and not just "over there."
- For mission is being "personal" and "relational" rather than just providing resources.
- ➤ For mission is that which helps another experience "transformation" (continued in column 2)

by teaching, leading and learning
new ways and skills rather than just a
"hand out."

For mission as that which may not change the world, but as that which can help transform the lives of people around us - who, in turn, will help transform the lives of their friends, family and neighbors and who, may help with us, to change a part of the world. Such mission does not just happen overnight - it takes time!

Sometimes "missional" is reflected in the work of the church community, such as the recent Christmas Day Dinner or the opportunities that are being offered at Rusch Elementary School.

And sometimes "missional" is that which is offered by numerous individuals of this church community in help and supporting our neighbors, friends and family members. Many times these "missional activities" may go unnoticed because it is that which just comes naturally to one who has experienced God's love and grace and seeks to share it freely with those around them.

Someone has summarized it this way: "God so loved the world that God gave His Son ... and the Son, in turn <u>sends us out</u> to bring a message of good news to all people."

May God bless and inspire us as we seek to explore and live out what it means to be people "on a mission from God."

"NEW" - BEGINNING IN JANUARY

The Session has made arrangements for a client from Northwoods, Inc to do janitorial work here at PPC on a "trial basis."

Adam will be working at the church 3 days a week in the mornings (Monday, Wednesday and Friday), approximately 2-3 hours each day (or as he is needed).

We are contracting with Northwoods for Adam for a 90 day trial period. During these 90 days Adam's "salary" will be covered by DVR.

After the 90 day period, the Session will be making a decision whether the church will be able to continue the working relationship as Adam's salary would then be paid by the church.

Adam is very excited about the opportunity to work here @ PPC. He has had experience with janitorial cleaning before so he should be a big help.

The Session has embarked on this new opportunity as unique way to reach out to the community around us, providing a means of support to someone who really wanted to work in a church setting.

If you might be interested in helping to cover the costs of Adam working here (after the 90 day period) - a one-time donation, a regular donation which could cover costs for a week / month, or if you have questions, please contact the Church Office or any of the Session members.

One of the opportunities PPC had during the summer months was to visit with Nikki Schoenborn, Principal at Rusch Elementary School.

She had shared that one of the ways in which we, right here in our neighborhood, could help young people would be to "volunteer" at the school.

So, here are some ways in which "you" (as an individual) and "we" (as a church community) can be a positive influence in the lives of young people.

- * Listening to children read (which helps young people to become better readers, which in turn helps them learn better, take better tests, become more confident etc)
- * Working on "math facts" (much the same as the reading aspect)
- * Sharing a "hobby" that we enjoy (do not have to be an "expert" just that which we enjoy and which can pass on)
- * Helping with an afterschool "club" among the things the children indicated interest in was building with legos sewing arts and crafts sports drama dance music (what do you like to do that children may like to learn?)

Sometimes we may think we cannot or do not make a difference in the world around us. Well, here's a chance to make a difference in the world - one child at a time!
