# Pastor's Page

At the recent John Knox Presbytery meeting someone remarked that it used to be common to call the ceremony at the conclusion of one's high school career the "commencement." Now, however, it is more common to call this "graduation." As the person asserted, "Graduation means something is ending. But, I like commencement because it refers not just to that which has come to an end, but also to that which is just beginning."

While I also like the concept of "commencement," I also have experienced that "endings" and "beginnings" are really connected in a strange way.

In June I again celebrate the anniversary of my ordination. Ordination was an "ending" for me as I left behind my place and time of training and preparation in order to go "out into the world." But, even more this "ending" was a transition of my status, my place in the church. For the first time since I had been confirmed, I would no longer be an "active church member." For to be ordained meant that my "membership" would now be with the "Presbytery."

I realized then that the only way to move ahead, the only way that this new life would unfold was in my being willing to trust and let go and follow. Of experiencing an ending in order for a beginning to happen.

This season of Pentecost in which we find ourselves is a time of "endings" and "beginnings." For the disciples / apostles this was an experience in which they were asked to lay aside their fears, to leave behind that which they have known and to trust God to lead them, guide them and to provide for them as they moved in a new direction. But, in order to do this they had to experience an ending of their "discipleship" (students / learners) in order to be transformed by the Spirit into "apostles" (those who are sent out).

They had to believe, to trust and to be convinced that their being "sent out as witnesses" was indeed a call of God. Yes, it was probably a little scary not knowing where God would take them. But, it was also very reassuring to know that wherever God would take them, that was where

God needed them to be. That was the promise that Christ had given them.

I suspect that those students (and their families too) "who are graduating" have a good understanding this sense of the interconnectedness of endings and beginnings.

As do those who have been "confirmed" and begin a new journey of membership with the church community and with God.

In reality, most of our lives are a series of endings and beginnings - some are rather non-descript - while others are defining moments in our lives.

Like those who have gone before us, who were no longer "disciples" but were now "apostles," may we always know that God is not only with us on our life's journey. And that God will also empower and lead us in ways, times and experiences that we may anticipate and also that we may not expect, anticipate or even want.

But, that is okay! It really is!

For if we trust that God is at work in and through us, if we believe that God really does seek for us to experience the gift of life, if we are convinced that God is with us and will provide for us ... then there really are no "endings" - but merely opportunities for new "beginnings" to burst forth.

So, whether it be commencement, confirmation, ordination - or any other of life's transitions - let us move ahead in the peace and love and hope of God.

For God is with us, and for us, now and forever more. Peace!

### PPC @ THE MALLARDS' GAME - JULY 15


