

# Pastor's Page

There is no doubt that the Portage Presbyterian Church "building" is a magnificent structure. However, if you want to see a fascinating view of this building, go to "Google Earth," type in the church's address and "zoom in."

What do you see?

Even more amazing to me is the "vision" and "planning" of those who designed and built this church building. I wonder if they, even in their wildest imaginations, thought about airplanes or drones or satellites which would fly over the church. They knew that they would never be able to see or experience the wonder of what they were doing. Yet the planned, envisioned and built.

So, this begs a question - "why?"

In a way they were anticipating that which was yet to come (that which they could not see) and were making a statement of faith for generations of people who would follow after them.

We cannot "see" the resurrection of Jesus. But we can "hear" and "learn" and "experience" the resurrection through those who did "see." Those first apostles had no idea of what "the church" would become. And yet, the proclamation of God's new life is offered in the words they speak and write - and in the radical impact and transformation that the resurrection experience had on their lives.

It is the words and the experiences of those who have come before us which provide the foundation upon which we continue to build the church community.

So it is for us, the Church today.

Like the first apostles, like those who drew up the plans for our church building, we are called to be the church in the present. But we are also called to provide for those who follow us a "statement of faith" by which they will be able to hear, to learn, to see and to experience the presence, the hope, the peace, the love and the saving power of God.

Through our words - and through our lives of faith - those around us now and those who will follow after us will know the amazing grace of God. Now, that's pretty awesome! And a bit scary too!

#### HELP WITH "HOMESTEAD TAX CREDIT?"

Do you need your Wisconsin Homestead Tax Credit prepared and filed?

Lee Roundy has volunteered to prepare and mail Homestead Tax Credit (Schedules H & H-EZ) paper filings for PPC members for free.

Appointments can be set up after worship on Sunday, *March 4<sup>th</sup>*, and *March 18<sup>th</sup>*. Check the Kiosk in Parry Hall for the Homestead Tax Credit Fact Sheet to see if you qualify for the Credit.

Lee will take the members on a first-come, first-served basis.

Appointments last 15 minutes, on average. If you're married, your spouse is required to be present. For your security and credit preparation accuracy, please bring your photo ID or driver's license, Social Security card, all forms of taxable and non-taxable income, 2017 property tax bill if you own your home or completed Rent Certificate if you rent (blank certificates available on Kiosk). If you are required to file an income tax return (1040Å, 1A, etc.), this credit will be prepared by your regular tax preparer as a part of that income tax return.

The "Sharing Supper" will be shared on Monday, March, 26!!!


Serving begins at 5:00 p.m. at the Bartels Middle School cafeteria.
