


"READERS" FOR ADVENT & CHRISTMAS

Pastor's Page

Have you ever heard of "TBT?"

"TBT" is shorthand for "Throw Back Thursdays." These "TBT's" tend to pop up in newspapers, on radio and on Facebook among other places.

Just the other day there was a "TBT" that made reference to the Milwaukee "Braves" winning the 1957 world championship. And then there was the "TBT" that mentioned the first landing on the moon. Or the "TBT" that noted that a particular song by the Beatles first hit the charts on "this date."

One that really caught my attention was the "TBT" that talked about Grandma's apron and kitchen. As I looked at the picture and read the paragraph, I found myself thinking back to my own grandmothers' kitchens - the sounds, the smells, the sights flooded my mind as if I were "back there again."

Why have these "TBTs" become more popular? They enable us to experience again the joy of another time in one's life - it comes alive again, if only for a little while.

And they help us to "remember" that our lives in the present are built upon the foundation of times, experiences and people with whom we have shared our journeys of life and faith.

As we enter into November, I would like to suggest that "TBT" might have another translation - "Throw Back Thanksgivings."

These would be our opportunities to "go back" and "give thanks" to those people and for those people who helped us, provided for us, guided us, inspired us, watched over us or made a difference for us.

In thinking through our litany of people we may discover that it is not always the length of time shared that is important. Rather, it seems what is more significant is "when" the experience was shared, "how" it was shared and "where" it was shared.

A "SERVICE OF HOPE" - DEC 8 @ 2:00PM

Some of us walk into Advent tethered to our unresolved yesterdays — On the way to Bethlehem, God gives us a hand...."

For many of us Advent and Christmas can be times of families being together, of singing joyous songs, smiles and renewed hope.

However, for some of us, this is also a time which may be difficult and challenging. We may be dealing with things such as ...

- ≈ a change in or loss of a job
- > the break-up of a relationship
- a death of a loved one
- a change or loss of health
- ≈ 'a loss of hope
- ≈ anger from unresolved situations
- feeling overwhelmed by all of the demands and expectations
- a sadness that comes with the progressive darkness of the days

These are all some of the things that we may carry with us as we move through this time of the year - and which make this season one of fear, dread and sadness.

Our "Service of Hope" worship service (on Dec 8 @ 2:00 p.m.) will provide anyone who comes a safe place, a sanctuary, where we can acknowledge what we are feeling without fear or judgment.

This is also a time when we reach out again to God, trusting that God will reassure us and renew us with His peace, His presence and His promise.

As we state for this evening, our prayer tonight is that we might have a moment of quiet peace as we reflect together on our journey to Bethlehem and this coming Christ. God will give us a hand in the darkness of our sorrow to move forward and to welcome the light of Christ, our eternal hope.

The "Service of Hope" worship service will be on *December 8*, @ 2:00 p.m. and will include the Celebration of the Lord's Supper.
