### Pastor's Page

We find ourselves in a season of "transitions."

While I enjoy all of the various seasons with which we are treated here in this part of the world, there is no doubt that the "transition" from Summer to Autumn is one of my favorites - AND one with which I struggle the most.

It is one of my "favorites" because I look forward to the beautiful colors of the hillsides, the slightly cooler temperatures and the harvests that result from the hard work of spring and summer with an anticipation of gardens and farms and orchards filled with good things.

Yet, this "transition" is one with which I also struggle because I "know" (from life's experience) that leaves of color give way to bare branches. Harvests of good things eventually end. And "slightly cooler" temperatures give way to (well, you know).

However, I also know (again, from life's experience) the story continues to unfold again and again, just as winter will eventually give way to "spring" - the emergence of "new life" and the celebration of resurrection! Yet, getting "from here" to "there" is not always easy!

We here at PPC also find ourselves going through a number of different "transitions" as well.

You will read in the Session information (in the newsletter) of two important "staff transitions" for those who have been vital participants in God's ministry here at PPC.

Cordy Connor, our long-standing organist and choir accompanist has decided to take a "medical leave." We are grateful for Cordy's faithful sharing of her time and musical gifts and we pray that she will experience the rest, healing and peace of God in this time away and be feeling better very soon.

Kathy Mittelstaedt, our long-standing. Financial Secretary, has submitted a letter of intent to "step away" from these responsibilities here at PPC. Kathy, who moved to Waunakee with her husband Jerry, is wanting to focus her time and energy with Jerry and their families who live in the area. We are very grateful to Kathy for her "ministry" here at PPC for over 28 years and will

greatly miss her compassion and care for all who came to the office.

In this time of transition please be sure to also keep the Personnel Committee in your prayers as they have already started their work.

And we will also be making our way through other "transitional experiences" in the coming months.

We will be sharing the third of three opportunities to consider "the work and ministry of God here at PPC" - as the "stewardship" emphasis concludes in October. We celebrate that God continues to work in and through this church community in wonderful and amazing ways. Because of your generous gifts of time and talents (remember the "Wish List") we are able to continue sharing and being God's "good news" in the community and world. Yet, as you may also be aware from reading the newsletters we have also been dealing with a challenging financial situation. The Session has been monitoring the finances as we head into the last quarter of the year. Though we have been blessed in past years with faithful and generous financial gifts, we also realize that this is something we cannot take for granted as we come to the end of this year and move into a new year. May we take the time to prayerfully and carefully consider the opportunities of sharing our variety of gifts for God's work and ministry here at and through PPC.

In the midst of our *transitions* may we take the time and opportunity to pause and lift in prayer one another individually and "we" as a church community. Whatever the transition we experience, it means that something in our world or in our lives has changed. And change can impact us in different ways. It is important that we continue to be this wonderful community of "God's good news" that we have been and continue to care, support, encourage and watch out for one another in and through these times and experiences.

And in the midst of our *transitions* may we take the time and opportunity to remember and be thankful for the calming and reassuring presence of the One who is with us right there in the midst of all "*transitions*" - God!

That's what we find in Psalm 46 with these words of reassurance and hope, in the midst of "transition" and change -

"God is our refuge and strength ... Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult ... The LORD of hosts is with us!"

Notice - the Psalm does not suggest that "change" will never happen. Only that in the midst of "change" God will always be there to lead, strengthen and love.

May God bless and keep and encourage each and every one of us as we journey into and through this "season of transitions."



And we are seeking "volunteers" to signup to help collect the offering during worship.



- ➢ Beginning in 2018 we learned "What Is Happening?" at Portage Presbyterian Church and how this building is used to make a difference in our community.
- ➤ Then we found out "Why?" as members of the PPC community shared their "stories" of being called to this faith community.
- We explored "How?" as we considered "how" God has blessed us with "gifts" and "how" we can share and participate in the ministry to which God calls us.
- ➣ We followed up in 2019 by asking "Who?" are the people and groups through whom God works to provide the means and opportunities for ministry.
- "When?" moved us to think about when we see God at work and how PPC works in partnership with others to provide important ministries of care, support and love

Over the last 2 years we found that "stewardship" could be amazing ... and fun ... and inspirational!
