G-2.0201 Deacons Defined

The ministry of deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures, or anyone in distress. Persons of spiritual character, honest repute, exemplary lives, brotherly and sisterly love, sincere compassion, and sound judgment should be chosen for this ministry.

Here At Portage Presbyterian -

Deacons assume a caring ministry role for those who are homebound, ill, or having a difficult time. This includes "home communions" as well as maintaining contact with people through visits, cards and calls. The Deacons also are responsible for the set up for our monthly communions during Sunday morning worship service and other seasonal worship services. Flower arrangements in the chancel area and those which are to be distributed to others are also part of the ministry of the Deacons. The Board of Deacons usually have monthly meetings which are established based on the availability of members.

Presbyterian Church "Book of Order"

G-2.0301 Ruling Elder Defined

As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with ministers of the Word and Sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships.

Here At Portage Presbyterian -

Ruling Elders (members of a Session) are asked to serve faithfully by participating in Session meetings, serving on at least one Session committee, helping to discern through prayer, study and conversation how and where God is leading us and lifting the Session and the congregation in prayer. Accepting ordination and / or installation as Ruling Elder means, among other things, that one is willing to commit the energy, intelligence, imagination and love to work on behalf of the Session and the Congregation.

Pastor's Page

Needless to say, when I read this excerpt below from Dietrich Bonhoeffer's "Life Together" I was shocked, surprised and concerned.

After all we have spent some time over the past few months considering "God's vision" for this church community. And then I read this

Beware of visions for church

God hates visionary dreaming; it makes the dreamer proud and pretentious. The man who fashions a visionary ideal of community demands that it be realized by God, by others, and by himself. He enters the community of Christians with his demands, sets up his own laws, and judges the brethren and God himself accordingly. He stands adamant, a living reproach to all others in the circle of the brethren. He acts as if he is the creator of the Christian community, as if his dream binds men together.

When things do not go his way, he calls the effort a failure. When his ideal picture is destroyed, he sees the community going to smash. So he becomes, first an accuser of his brethren, then an accuser of God, and finally the despairing accuser of himself.

Because God has already laid the only foundation of our fellowship, because God has bound us together in one body with other Christians in Jesus Christ, long before we entered into common life with them, we enter into that common life not as demanders but as thankful recipients. We thank God for giving us brethren who live by his call, by his forgiveness, and his promise. We do not complain of what God does not give us; we rather thank God for what he does give us daily.

Wow! Dietrich Bonhoeffer is a person that I admire for his theological perspectives - but even more for his willingness to "walk the talk" even when his choices were all less than desirable in the face of Nazi Germany's idolatry.

So, at first glance it appears we have been, according to Bonhoeffer, doing that which God "hates" with our discussion and consideration of "vision." And I don't know about you but the prospect of being "hated by God" is not an enviable position in which I want to find myself.

Now what?

Well, when one reads the above excerpt

carefully one discovers that what we are doing is not "hated," but in fact is exactly what God desires and challenges us (and others) to do.

Notice, that Bonhoeffer points to the "visionary dreaming ... which makes the dreamer proud and pretentious." Why? Because, as Bonhoeffer points out, the "vision" is all about what "the dreamer" wants and believes and demands.

The point I believe that Bonhoeffer makes is that it is God who is to be the source of the visioning and the dreaming rather than looking to or depending on a person or persons. When it is a "personal" vision, Bonhoeffer's description is striking - "When things do not go (one's) way, (that one) calls the effort a failure."

However, if this "visioning" is instead rooted in a listening for, a discerning of and a following of God's lead then that vision will be one of which we will not need to be afraid. In fact it will be one to be celebrated!

This, in fact, is what we have been striving to do - to listen for God's vision for PPC. So, just to be clear - we are not "hated!"

This Fall we will be inviting those who would like to participate to take the "Next Step" of learning and discerning God's vision as we will engage in times of Bible study, discussion and prayer.

If you take a look at the "board" in Parry Hall, you will find that there are a number of index cards there with a wide variety of insights, ideas and observations. It is wonderful to see God at work in and through this church community in this way. Please be sure to keep adding "cards" to the board as you contemplate "what God's vision is for PPC."



This is a perfect opportunity for those who seek to help make a difference in the community by offering your time and presence as a shelter volunteer.


