We are "on a mission from God."

Eleven people from Region 5 of John Knox Presbytery are heading for the "upper part of lower Michigan" as a part of this year's mission trip experience.

What are we doing? We will be working as groundskeepers, maintenance and upkeep for Camp Westminster on Higgins Lake.

And that's about it! That's all I can tell you. Because we have never been there before.

There is something both exciting and uncomfortable in this year's trip for me.

The exciting part is that each and every one of the mission trips that I have made since 2000's trip to Chattanooga have been inspiring, life-changing experiences. And I have no doubts that this year's trip will be as well. I enjoy having the opportunity to be the "hands and feet of Jesus" as we say.

However, the uncomfortable part of this is that we are going somewhere we've never been before. There is no doubt it is easier for me to go where I've previously visited and know the streets, the people, the work, the food and the softness rating of the bed upon which I will sleep.

This year will be different. We are still "on a mission from God." But we will be "doing mission" in a place that is very unfamiliar.

Yet, that's okay. Because God does not call us only to those places and people with whom we are comfortable or with whom we already have a good relationship. If I stop to think about it, each of those sites that we have re-visited have, at some time, been a place we visited for the first time.

As has always been the case, from the first trip in 2000 and on, each and every mission trip has been a time and a place where I have seen and experienced God at work!

Even though the places and faces change, the One constant through it all - is that when we trust that God is at work, that God is leading, we will always be right where we need to be - right where God needs us to be!

Yes, we are "on a mission from God!" What a great trip it will be!

A couple of notes about "transportation" ...




