





Pastor's Page

"Power Naps!" This was the term used in a particular study that I read that concluded that it is healthy for one's mind, body and spirit to "nap" in the afternoon - preferably after lunch.

This "nap time," the study suggests, will recharge, renew and reinvigorate one so that we actually work more efficiently and can have more energy at the end of the day to enjoy our lives more.

In response some businesses and companies are even building in "naps" as a part of their daily schedules.

My life has come full circle!

What seems like only a few years ago I was sent to Kindergarten at the South School with a "resting pad" upon which we would all be required to "take a rest" after lunch.

My grandfather would come in from the fields for lunch and would proceed, after lunch, to lay down on the floor to "catch a quick 40 winks" before he would head back out on the farm.

There are even some ethnic cultures that build "rest" or "siesta" time into their understanding of the balance of life.

This study simply reinforces that which we all know - that we do need to take time for rest, recreation, and renewal.

How and where we find and experience these times and places varies for each of us. And that is good! It would not be good if you and everyone else all ended up camping in the same place that I do.

Yet, it is important for us, as God's children and as God's church to make sure that we do find and practice times of "rest."

The whole concept of "Sabbath" is rooted in the need to "rest" and "reflect" as a part of the balance of our lives and our faith in relationship to God.

The "summer season" into which we will soon find ourselves has been traditionally a time in which to-do lists shift and we look for opportunities to have a little "R & R."

However, the reality is that for some Summer's schedule may not change that much. While we may not be doing the same things, we

"SUMMER WED NITE @ PPC"

As Summer comes the "Wed Nite @ PPC" program will continue through the summer! But in a special way!

We WILL NOT be gathering every Wednesday evening as we did during the school year.

However, we are planning to come together once a month in *June, July and August* to share a lite meal, fellowship, projects and activities and worship.

Here's what we will be doing ...

On Wednesday, June 14 we will gather at 5:30 p.m. for a lite meal.

Our "theme" for this "Summer Wed Nite" will be to learn more about the River Haven Homeless Shelter and how we might be able to help support and care for those in our community in special need.

Cindy LeGrand of River Haven will be with us to provide information and answer questions.

One of our projects this evening will be for Judy Taylor to teach us how to make "sleeping mats" out of ordinary plastic grocery bags for those who are homeless.

Then, at 7:00 p.m. we will gather for a time of worship - outside if the weather permits!

"Summer Wed Nite" in July will be on July 19th. This is being planned as a "Christmas in July" experience - afterall, who says Christmas cannot be celebrated any time?

Then, plans are being made for the August "Summer Wed Nite" on August 23 as learning more about the "backpack program" at the Rusch Elementary School and to see if there are ways we can help support this special program.

All ages are encouraged to come and share in these "Summer Wed Nite" experiences!

SUMMER 2017 "FOOD FOR KIDS"

We need your help as we continue the summer program of providing a meal for young people in the Portage community.

This will be the 4th year of the "Summer Food Program."

In the first year approximately 800-900 meals were served over a 10 week period.

With the second year the meal sites were expanded to 2 sites and the number of meals served over the 10 week period was a little over 1800.

Last year we continued to serve at two sites and for the 10 week period the number of meals jumped to 3100.

For this coming summer we will continue to serve meals for young people at two sites: Goodyear Park (near the splash pad / skate park); and at the Library.

However, we are also looking to expand our food opportunities with a "more mobile" option which would have lunches served at a couple of other places in the city.

Also we are wanting to expand from 10 weeks to the "whole summer." This would enable those who need these meals to have them available until school starts.

One other part that is being changed is that the meals will be served Monday - Friday (rather than Monday-Thursday).

We are always looking for volunteers to help make this program work well. The reality is that without volunteers and the support of the whole community, the "Summer Food Program" would not exist!

The goal of this "Summer Food Program" is simple - that no child goes hungry in Portage!
