PENTECOST OFFERING

Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the The Holy Spirit remains with us still, connecting us with the church of the past, continuing to inspire the church of today, and pointing us to the church of the future. Each year, this celebration is marked by receiving the Pentecost Offering, which nurtures the faith of those who are the church to come--children, youth, and young adults.

Our church will retain 40% of this Offering which gives us the opportunity to invest in the future of the church by supporting ministries that encourage, develop, and support our young people, as well as provide assistance to at-risk children.

The Offering will be collected on Pentecost Sunday that is June 9th. Offering envelopes are available in your envelope box and in the pew racks and will be attached to the June newsletter. We will again have coin boxes to collect your loose change on the table in Parry Hall. Last year we collected \$291.91 of which \$116.76 stayed locally. Let's try to "up" that amount this year. Several members mentioned that they liked having the coin box on their kitchen counter to collect their change.

POUNDS FOR THE PANTRY

Our Pounds for the Pantry Drive begins on May 1. Our goal is to collect 500# during the month of May. When you bring your items to church rather than put them in the basket set them on the table in Parry Hall and we will record the weight on our chart so that at the end of worship everyone will know how much we collected and how close we are to our goal of the 500#. Last year we collected 770# # so let's try and match or beat that this year. A reminder that some of the items needed are jelly, spaghetti noodles and sauce, Tuna and Hamburger Helper, canned fruit and vegetables, pancake mix and syrup, peanut butter, bottled juice, canned stew, cereal, tuna, Manwich, ketchup and mustard, This is also a good time to bring the heavy items such as flour, sugar, bottled juice and laundry soap. Check for expiration dates because we cannot accept any item that has expired.

Pastor's Page

The response of the disciples to the "good news" of Jesus' resurrection is not quite what one might expect.

When they are confronted with the news that the one they thought to be dead was alive, that Jesus had risen - just as He said - their initial reactions are not joy and celebration. Rather we read of those closest to Jesus having doubts, being afraid and not really believing such a thing could have happened.

We who are many centuries removed from the first Easter find it easy to ridicule those who should have known better. Had not Jesus told them what was going to happen? Did they not listen?

Well, yes - and yes!

But on the way to Easter they encountered some of the most difficult, most painful and most discouraging experiences of their lives. That which they had "heard" became obscured by betrayals, death, sadness, loss and fear. Life happened!

They believed! They really did! It was "good news" when they heard the stories of Jesus' resurrection and when they are encountered by the risen Christ.

Nevertheless they also had to work their way through all of the distractions and temptations that life had thrown at them to get to the point where this became "good news" that they could accept for themselves. Their difficulties, their pain and their discouragement did not just disappear. It took time.

Jesus respected the struggles with which the disciples were dealing. He appreciates all with which they were dealing - both the difficult and the celebratory. And over time Christ patiently and lovingly guides them to a time when they could experience this "new life" and anticipate the days which were yet to come.

There is no doubt - the resurrection of Jesus Christ is "good news!" We celebrate this new reality with joyful songs, shouts of "He is risen" and other traditions.

Still in the midst of our journeys there are times when "life happens" and we can find ourselves thrown into situations which we do not understand and circumstances that are beyond

control. Fear and uncertainty and doubt and questions can abound.

Does this mean that we have somehow "failed" as God's people or we need to just "get with it?"

No! It simply means that, like those first disciples who went before us, we are God's people trying to live lives that are not always perfect and not always easy.

Easter is God's proof to us that God does not give up! "Neither death nor life, nor things present nor things to come will ever separate us from God's love for us in Christ Jesus" is the way that the Apostle Paul says it.

Wherever we are on our life and faith journey, God meets us there first and foremost with God's presence. Then, when we are ready and able, God helps us and leads us through the muck and mud to start on a new and right path.

Think about it - there is a reason that among the first words that the disciples hear again and again after Jesus' resurrection are "do not be afraid!"

Do not be afraid! Christ is risen!

Christ is risen indeed!

May God's peace be with us all as we make our way through these days after Easter! And into the rest of our lives!

"HARMONY FOR THE HOMELESS"



Each card has FIVE car washes on it.


If you were to purchase these at the store, they would cost \$50.00 (\$10.00/wash)
